

of this product led to Apple's vision in the Bluetooth advancement.


Let's look at it from a consumer's perspectives.

There was a lot of controversies due to the circumstances of changing the headphone jacks as consumers did not and still does not understand Apple's reasons for this courageous move in developing this idea. On a recent survey, it is noted that there are more negative opinions rather than positive ones. Even though Airpods and wireless headphones were introduced, these advancements cannot win over consumers opinions into liking the idea of the new headphone jacks which started from 2016 and the production of this design continues to course through up until now.

Discarding the 3.5mm headphone jack means that there is only one option for both charging and using headphones. Thus, this give the inconvenience to those who are wanting to listen to music and charge their phones simultaneously, if they do not own wireless headphones.

Comparing the popularity between wireless and wired headphones, it is concluded that wireless has the upper hand. This is supported through a recent personal survey, as Bluetooth is running at 71.43% whilst wired is 28.57%. Many consumers prefer Bluetooth headphones as they are more convenient to use, portable, easy access and has freedom to move.
